Persons who comment on the environmental review of this project will be placed on the Commission’s environmental mailing list, and will receive notification when the environmental documents (EA or EIS) are issued for this project and will be notified of meetings associated with the Commission’s environmental review process.

The Commission considers all comments received about the project in determining the appropriate action to be taken. However, the filing of a comment alone will not serve to make the filer a party to the proceeding. To become a party, you must intervene in the proceeding. For instructions on how to intervene, see below.

Interventions

Any person, which includes individuals, organizations, businesses, municipalities, and other entities,⁶ has the option to file a motion to intervene in this proceeding. Only intervenors have the right to request rehearing of Commission orders issued in this proceeding and to subsequently challenge the Commission’s orders in the U.S. Circuit Courts of Appeal.

To intervene, you must submit a motion to intervene to the Commission in accordance with Rule 214 of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure⁷ and the regulations under the NGA⁸ by the intervention deadline for the project, which is May 20, 2025. As described further in Rule 214, your motion to intervene must state, to the extent known, your position regarding the proceeding, as well as your interest in the proceeding. For an individual, this could include your status as a

landowner, ratepayer, resident of an impacted community, or recreationist. You do not need to have property directly impacted by the project in order to intervene. There are two ways to submit your motion to intervene. In both instances, please reference the Project docket number CP25–209–000 in your submission.

Any subsequent submissions by an intervenor must be served on the applicant and all other parties to the proceeding. Contact information for parties can be downloaded from the service list at the eService link on FERC Online. Service can be via email with a link to the document.

All timely, unopposed⁹ motions to intervene are automatically granted by operation of Rule 214(c)(1).¹⁰ Motions to intervene that are filed after the intervention deadline are untimely, and may be denied. Any late-filed motion to intervene must show good cause for being late and must explain why the time limitation should be waived and provide justification by reference to factors set forth in Rule 214(d) of the Commission’s Rules and Regulations.¹¹ A person obtaining party status will be placed on the service list maintained by the Secretary of the Commission and will receive copies (paper or electronic) of all documents filed by the applicant and by all other parties.

Tracking the Proceeding

GridLiance Heartland LLC; Notice of Motion for Extension of Time

On November 8, 2024, GridLiance Heartland LLC (GridLiance Heartland)

filed a motion for an extension of time to submit a compliance filing explaining the timelines for calculating or submitting ambient-adjusted ratings (AAR) in compliance with Order Nos. 881 and 881-A¹ and the Commission's July 27, 2023, order² to implement GridLiance Heartland's compliance revisions in Attachment T to its Open Access Transmission Tariff (OATT).³

GridLiance Heartland states that it no longer retains operational control over any of its transmission facilities and no longer provides transmission service for any transmission lines under the GridLiance Heartland OATT.⁴ GridLiance Heartland explains that because all of its facilities are now under the operational control of the Midcontinent Independent System Operator, Inc. (MISO), AARs for its transmission lines will be submitted directly to MISO in accordance with the timelines required by the MISO procedures, rather than being calculated and posted pursuant to Attachment T of the GridLiance Heartland OATT.⁵ GridLiance Heartland therefore requests an extension of time to submit the further compliance filing required by the July 2023 Order until such time as GridLiance Heartland acquires transmission lines that are governed by the GridLiance Heartland OATT.⁶

Answers to the motion must be filed by 5:00 p.m. Eastern Time on Tuesday, May 6, 2025.

On May 1, 2017, and materially amended on December 7, 2020, Great

River Hydro, LLC filed applications for new major licenses to operate its 32.4-megawatt (MW) Vernon Hydroelectric Project (Vernon Project; FERC No. 1904), 40.8-MW Bellows Falls Hydroelectric Project (Bellows Falls Project; FERC No. 1855), and 35.6-MW Wilder Hydroelectric Project (Wilder Project; FERC No. 1892) (collectively, projects).
