Respondents maintain and provide the information required by 18 CFR part 358 on their public websites. This requirement ensures that non-affiliated shippers obtain comparable access to non-public transportation information which allows them to compete with marketing affiliates on a more equal basis.

18 CFR 250.16, and the FERC-592 Log/Format

This form (log/format) provides the electronic formats for maintaining

information on discounted transportation transactions and capacity allocation to support monitoring of activities of interstate pipeline marketing affiliates.

Without this information collection:

- the Commission would have difficulty effectively monitoring whether pipelines are giving discriminatory preference to their marketing affiliates; and
- non-affiliated shippers, state commissions, and others have difficulty determining whether they have been harmed by affiliate preference,

preparing submissions for rate cases and other proceedings.

Type of Respondents: Natural gas pipelines.
