

the protection of investors and the public interest because the proposal seeks to amend, effective upon filing, the Exchange's CAT Compliance Rule to reflect that the expiration date for exemptive relief relating to timestamp granularity is now April 8, 2030, and the proposal does not introduce any novel regulatory issues. Accordingly, the Commission designates the proposed rule change to be operative upon filing.¹⁷

At any time within 60 days of the filing of the proposed rule change, the Commission summarily may temporarily suspend such rule change if it appears to the Commission that such action is necessary or appropriate in the public interest, for the protection of investors, or otherwise in furtherance of the purposes of the Act. If the Commission takes such action, the Commission will institute proceedings to determine whether the proposed rule change should be approved or disapproved.
