### Notice of Suspension and Commencement of Proposed Debarment Proceedings

**AGENCY:** Federal Communications Commission.

**ACTION:** Notice.

**SUMMARY:** The Enforcement Bureau (the Bureau) gives notice of the suspension of Donna Woods from the schools and libraries universal service support mechanism (or E-Rate Program) and all universal service support mechanisms.

Additionally, the Bureau gives notice that debarment proceedings are commencing against Ms. Woods, or any person who has an existing contract with or intends to contract with him to provide or receive services in matters arising out of activities associated with or related to the schools and libraries support, may respond by filing an opposition request, supported by documentation.

**DATES:** Opposition requests must be submitted within 30 days of receiving the suspension letter or by May 18, 2026, whichever comes first. The Bureau will decide on any opposition request within 90 days.

Dear Ms. Woods:

The Enforcement Bureau (Bureau) of the Federal Communications Commission (Commission or FCC) received notice of your convictions for wire fraud and conspiracy to commit mail and wire fraud, in violation of 18 U.S.C. 1341, 1343, and 1349, arising out of activities associated with the federal schools and libraries universal service support mechanism (E-Rate program).<sup>1</sup> The crime involved knowingly conspiring with another to defraud the E-Rate program by using your position as CEO of Nova Charter School (Nova) in Texas, to select your co-conspirator's company, ADI Engineering, Inc. (ADI), as the school's E-Rate provider.<sup>2</sup> Consequently, pursuant to 47 CFR 54.8, this letter constitutes official notice of your suspension from the E-Rate program and all federal universal service support mechanisms.<sup>3</sup> While suspended, you are prohibited from participating in or receiving any benefit associated with all federal universal service support mechanisms, including the E-Rate program. Additionally, in accordance with the Commission's rules, the Bureau is commencing a proceeding to debar you from future participation in all federal universal service support mechanisms for three years.<sup>4</sup>

## I. Notice of Suspension

The Commission has established procedures to prevent persons who have defrauded the government or engaged in similar acts through activities associated with or related to the [E-Rate program] from receiving the benefits associated with that program.<sup>5</sup> The statutory provisions and Commission rules relating to the E-Rate program are designed to ensure E-Rate funds are used for their intended purpose.<sup>6</sup> Schools may receive E-Rate program funding for eligible goods and services by filing application forms, seeking competitive bids, and selecting the most cost-effective vendor.<sup>7</sup> The E-Rate program rules prohibit an E-Rate vendor or anyone associated with an E-Rate vendor from participating in the application process or vendor selection.<sup>8</sup> Solicitations for E-Rate services must be based on fair and open competitive bidding, free from any conflicts of interest.<sup>9</sup>

You were found guilty by a jury on three counts of wire fraud and one count of conspiracy to commit mail and wire fraud that involved knowingly and intentionally devising a scheme to defraud the E-Rate program in exchange for a kickback.<sup>10</sup> You and your co-conspirator caused Nova to choose ADI as its E-Rate service provider, even though ADI was not chosen through a fair and open competitive bidding process as required by E-Rate rules.<sup>11</sup> You and your co-conspirator made false representations to the Universal Service Administrative Company (USAC) to convince USAC's agents that Nova's selection of ADI complied with the E-Rate program rules, that ADI completed the E-Rate discount work for which it had been selected, and that Nova paid ADI the required 10% co-pay for its 90% E-Rate discount.<sup>12</sup> You and your co-conspirator produced fraudulent invoices used to induce USAC to pay ADI approximately \$337,951.06 in E-Rate discount funds for work that ADI was not entitled to perform and did not perform.<sup>13</sup>

In January 2020, the United States District Court for the Northern District of Texas sentenced you to eighty-seven months in prison followed by two years of supervised release.<sup>14</sup> The court also ordered you to pay \$337,951.06 in restitution, a \$25,000 fine, and a \$400 special assessment fee.<sup>15</sup>

Pursuant to section 54.8(d) of the Commission's rules,<sup>16</sup> your conviction requires the Bureau to suspend you from: (a) participating in any activities associated with or related to the E-Rate program, including the receipt of funds or discounted services through the E-Rate program, or consulting with, assisting, or advising applicants or service providers regarding the E-Rate program; and (b) participating in any activities associated with or related to all federal universal service support mechanisms.<sup>17</sup> Your

suspension becomes effective upon either your receipt of this letter or its publication in the Federal Register, whichever comes first.<sup>18</sup>

In accordance with the Commission's suspension and debarment rules, you may contest this suspension or the scope of this suspension by filing arguments, with any relevant documents, within thirty calendar days of your receipt of this letter or publication of notice of the suspension in the Federal Register, whichever comes first.<sup>19</sup> Such requests, however, will not ordinarily be granted.<sup>20</sup> The Bureau may reverse or limit the scope of a suspension only upon a finding of extraordinary circumstances.<sup>21</sup> The Bureau will decide any request to reverse or modify a suspension within ninety calendar days of its receipt of such request.<sup>22</sup>

## II. Initiation of Debarment Proceedings

In addition to requiring your immediate suspension from all federal universal service support mechanisms, including the E-Rate program, your conviction is cause for debarment as defined in section 54.8(c) of the Commission's rules.<sup>23</sup> Therefore, pursuant to section 54.8(b) of the Commission's rules, your conviction requires the Bureau to commence debarment proceedings against you.<sup>24</sup>

As with the suspension process, you may contest the proposed debarment or the scope of the proposed debarment by filing arguments and any relevant documentation within thirty calendar days of receipt of this letter or its publication in the Federal Register, whichever comes first.<sup>25</sup> The Bureau, in the absence of extraordinary circumstances, will notify you of its decision to debar within ninety calendar days of receiving any information you may have filed.<sup>26</sup> If the Bureau decides to debar you, its decision will become effective upon either your receipt of a debarment notice or publication of the decision in the Federal Register, whichever comes first.<sup>27</sup>

If and when your debarment becomes effective, you will be prohibited from participating in activities associated with or related to all federal universal service support mechanisms, including the E-Rate program, for three years from the date of debarment.<sup>28</sup> The Bureau may set a longer debarment period or extend an existing debarment period if necessary to protect the public interest.<sup>29</sup> Pursuant to the Commission's rules, should you choose to contest the scope or length of any such debarment, you must file arguments and any relevant documentation within thirty calendar days of receipt of this letter or the publication in the Federal Register of such proposed debarment, whichever is earlier.<sup>30</sup>

### Unleashing American Drone Dominance

**AGENCY:** Federal Communications Commission.

**ACTION:** Notice and request for comments.

**SUMMARY:** In this document, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC or Commission) seeks comment on additional means by which the Commission can continue to fulfill its public interest mandate and achieve American drone dominance. The Commission's Wireless Telecommunications Bureau and Office of Engineering and Technology seek

input on an array of reforms the Commission might take to unleash American drone dominance, including: alleviating unnecessary regulatory burdens; ensuring that American drone manufacturers and users have sufficient spectrum for drone testing and operations; facilitating and encouraging American firms' investment in drone capabilities, infrastructure development, and innovative and advanced capabilities; ensuring regulatory clarity and technical access for United States-based manufacturers and trusted suppliers; coordinating more effectively with other federal agencies; streamlining the Commission's experimental licensing rules; and establishing additional dedicated drone innovation zones or testbeds in partnership with other entities.
