Common Alloy Aluminum Sheet From Taiwan: Final Results of Antidumping Duty Administrative Review; 2023-2024

AGENCY: Enforcement and Compliance, International Trade Administration, Department of Commerce.

SUMMARY: The U.S. Department of Commerce (Commerce) determines that a producer and exporter made sales of common alloy aluminum sheet (aluminum sheet) from Taiwan at below normal value during the period of review (POR), April 1, 2023, through March 31, 2024.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:

Background

On August 11, 2025, Commerce published in the *Federal Register* the *Preliminary Results* of this review and invited interested parties to comment.¹ Due to the lapse in appropriations and Federal Government shutdown, on November 14, 2025, Commerce tolled all deadlines in administrative proceedings by 47 days.² Additionally, due to workflow delays and outages experienced by Enforcement and Compliance's Antidumping and Countervailing Duty Centralized Electronic Service System (ACCESS), on November 24, 2025, Commerce tolled all deadlines in administrative proceedings by 21 days.³ On February 2, 2026, and April 9, 2026, Commerce extended the deadline for issuing the final results by 53 and 7 days, respectively.⁴ Accordingly, the deadline for these final results is now April 16, 2026.

A summary of the events that occurred since the *Preliminary Results* may be found in the Issues and Decision Memorandum.⁵ The Issues and Decision Memorandum is a public document and

Commerce conducted this administrative review in accordance with section 751(a)(1)(B) of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (the Act).

Scope of the Order⁶

The product covered by the scope of the *Order* is aluminum sheet from Taiwan. For a full description of the scope of the *Order*, see the Issues and Decision Memorandum.

Analysis of Comments Received

We addressed the issues raised in the case and rebuttal briefs for these final results in the Issues and Decision Memorandum. A list of the issues that parties raised, and to which we responded in the Issues and Decision Memorandum, is provided in the appendix to this notice.

Changes Since the Preliminary Results

Based on our analysis of the comments received from interested parties, we made no changes to the *Preliminary Results*. For a discussion of the issues presented, see the Issues and Decision Memorandum.

Final Results of Administrative Review

We determine the following estimated weighted-average dumping margin for the period April 1, 2023, through March 31, 2024:
