#### Scout V Hugoton Gathering, LP, Pan-Hugoton Gathering Company LLC; Notice of Application and Establishing Intervention Deadline

Take notice that on April 2, 2026, Scout V Hugoton Gathering, LP (Scout), 13800 Montfort Drive, Dallas, Texas 75240, and Pan-Hugoton Gathering Company LLC (PHGC), 370 17th Street, Suite 2900, Denver, Colorado, 80202,

filed a joint application under sections 7(b) and 7(c) of the Natural Gas Act (NGA) and Part 157 of the Commission's regulations requesting (1) permission for Scout to abandon, by sale, approximately 249.1 miles of 1-inch to 26-inch-diameter pipeline and related facilities and appurtenances (West Hugoton System); and (2) a certificate for PHGC to own and operate the West Hugoton System, and to provide transportation services thereupon under the same rates, terms, and conditions as under Scout's currently effective tariff. PHGC also requests a blanket certificate pursuant to Part 284 of the Commission's regulations, authorizing PHGC to transport natural gas for others on a firm and interruptible basis, and a blanket certificate pursuant to Part 157 of the Commission's regulations, authorizing PHGC to perform certain routine construction, operation, and abandonment activities, all as more fully set forth in the application which is on file with the Commission and open for public inspection.

Pursuant to section 157.9 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure,<sup>1</sup> within 90 days of this Notice the Commission staff will either: complete its environmental review and place it into the Commission's public record (eLibrary) for this proceeding; or issue a Notice of Schedule for Environmental Review. If a Notice of Schedule for Environmental Review is issued, it will indicate, among other milestones, the anticipated date for the Commission staff's issuance of the final environmental impact statement (FEIS) or environmental assessment (EA) for this proposal. The filing of an EA in the Commission's public record for this proceeding or the issuance of a Notice of Schedule for Environmental Review will serve to notify federal and state agencies of the timing for the completion of all necessary reviews, and the subsequent need to complete all federal authorizations within 90 days of the date of issuance of the Commission staff's FEIS or EA.

#### Public Participation

There are three ways to become involved in the Commission's review of this project: you can file comments on the project, you can protest the filing, and you can file a motion to intervene in the proceeding. There is no fee or cost for filing comments or intervening. The deadline for filing a motion to intervene is 5:00 p.m. Eastern Time on May 6, 2026. 385.2001<sup>5</sup> of the Commission's regulations. A protest may also serve as a motion to intervene so long as the protestor states it also seeks to be an intervenor.

To ensure that your comments or protests are timely and properly recorded, please submit your comments on or before 5:00 p.m. Eastern Time on May 6, 2026.

Persons who comment on the environmental review of this project will be placed on the Commission's environmental mailing list, and will receive notification when the environmental documents (EA or EIS) are issued for this project and will be notified of meetings associated with the Commission's environmental review process.

The Commission considers all comments received about the project in determining the appropriate action to be taken. However, the filing of a comment alone will not serve to make the filer a party to the proceeding. To become a party, you must intervene in the proceeding. For instructions on how to intervene, see below.

#### Interventions

Any person, which includes individuals, organizations, businesses, municipalities, and other entities,<sup>6</sup> has the option to file a motion to intervene in this proceeding. Only intervenors have the right to request rehearing of Commission orders issued in this proceeding and to subsequently challenge the Commission's orders in the U.S. Circuit Courts of Appeal.

To intervene, you must submit a motion to intervene to the Commission in accordance with Rule 214 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure<sup>7</sup> and the regulations under the NGA<sup>8</sup> by the intervention deadline for the project, which is 5:00 p.m. Eastern Time on May 6, 2026. As described further in Rule 214, your motion to intervene must state, to the extent known, your position regarding the proceeding, as well as your interest in the proceeding. For an individual, this could include your status as a landowner, ratepayer, resident of an impacted community, or recreationist. You do not need to have property directly impacted by the project in order to intervene. On February 17, 2026, Tygart LLC (licensee) filed an extension of time request pursuant to Articles 301 and 410 of the license for the Tygart Hydroelectric Project No. 12613.<sup>1</sup> On March 27, 2026, the licensee filed a notice of withdrawal of the request. The unconstructed project is located at the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers’ (Corps) Tygart Dam on the Tygart River in the community of Grafton in Taylor County, West Virginia. The project occupies federal land administered by the Corps.

No motion in opposition to the notice of withdrawal has been filed, and the Commission has taken no action to disallow the withdrawal. Pursuant to Rule 216(b) of the Commission’s Rules of Practice and Procedure,<sup>2</sup> the withdrawal of the extension of time request became effective on April 13, 2026,<sup>3</sup> and this proceeding is hereby terminated.
