

congressional certification transmittal number 23–75 of the possible sale, under Section 36(b)(1) of the Arms Export Control Act, of thirty-six (36) AIM–120C–8 Advanced Medium Range Air to Air Missiles (AMRAAM); and one (1) AIM–120C–8 AMRAAM Guidance Section. Also included were Common Munitions Built-In-Test/Reprogramming Equipment; ADU–891/E adapter group computer test sets; AIM–120 spare control sections and containers; other spare parts, consumables, accessories, and repair/return support; munitions support and support equipment; classified software delivery and support; classified and unclassified publications and technical documentation; contractor logistics support; personnel training and training equipment; studies and surveys; transportation support; U.S. Government and contractor engineering, technical, and logistics support services; and other related elements of logistics and program support. The estimated total value was \$100 million. Major defense equipment (MDE) constituted \$75.9 million of this total.

On October 4, 2024, Congress was notified by congressional certification transmittal number 24–0Y of the possible sale, under Section 36(b)(5)(C) of the Arms Export Control Act of the addition of the following MDE items: twenty-four (24) AIM–120C–8 AMRAAM; and eight (8) AIM–120C–8 AMRAAM-Extended Range (AMRAAM-ER) missiles. The following non-MDE items were also included: AMRAAM-ER load trainers; and weapon system support including software. The estimated MDE value was increased by \$72 million to a revised \$147.9 million. The estimated non-MDE value was increased by \$8 million to a revised \$32.1 million. The estimated total case value increased by \$80 million to a revised \$180 million. MDE constituted \$147.9 million of this total.

This transmittal notifies the inclusion of the following additional MDE items: seventy-three (73) AIM–120C–8 AMRAAM; and fifty-two (52) AMRAAM-ER. The following non-MDE items will also be included: AMRAAM captive air training missiles; weapons support equipment; and other related elements of logistics and program support. The estimated total value of the new items is \$322 million. The estimated MDE value will increase by \$262 million to a revised \$409.9 million. The estimated non-MDE value will increase by \$60 million to a revised \$92.1 million. The estimated total case value will increase by \$322 million to a revised \$502 million. MDE constitutes \$409.9 million of this total.

(iv) (U) *Significance*: This notification accounts for requested additional MDE and non-MDE not included in the original notification. The inclusion of this MDE represents an increase in capability over what was previously notified. The proposed sale will support Lithuania's commercial purchase of the National Advanced Surface-to-Air Missile System.

(v) (U) *Justification*: This proposed sale will support the foreign policy and national security of the United States by helping to improve the security of a NATO Ally that is an important force for ensuring peace and stability in Europe.

(vi) (U) *Sensitivity of Technology*: The Sensitivity of Technology Statement contained in the original notification applies to the additional items reported here.

The highest level of classification of defense articles, components, and services included in this potential sale is SECRET.

(iii) *Description and Quantity or Quantities of Articles or Services under Consideration for Purchase*: Foreign Military Sales (FMS) case LH–B–LAV was below congressional notification threshold at \$19.5 million (\$10.5 million in major defense equipment (MDE)) and included sixteen (16) AIM–9X Block II Sidewinder tactical missiles; two (2) AIM–9X Block II tactical guidance units; training; weapon system support; training aids and devices; spare parts; and other related elements of logistics and program support. The Government of Lithuania has requested that the case be amended to include one hundred fifty-two (152) AIM 9X Block II Sidewinder tactical missiles; eight (8) AIM–9X Block II tactical guidance units; and six (6) AIM–9X Block II captive air training missiles. The following non-MDE items will also be included: U.S. Government and contractor engineering, technical, and logistics support services; and other related elements of logistics and program support. This amendment will cause the case to exceed the notification threshold, and thus notification of the entire program is required. The above notification requirements are combined as follows:

Major Defense Equipment (MDE):

One hundred sixty-eight (168) AIM–9X Block II Sidewinder tactical missiles

Ten (10) AIM–9X Block II tactical guidance units

Six (6) AIM–9X Block II captive air training missiles

POLICY JUSTIFICATION

Lithuania—AIM-9X Sidewinder Block II Missiles

The Government of Lithuania has requested to buy an additional one hundred fifty-two (152) AIM 9X Block II Sidewinder tactical missiles; eight (8) AIM-9X Block II tactical guidance units; six (6) AIM-9X Block II captive air training missiles; U.S. Government and contractor engineering, technical, and logistics support services; and other related elements of logistics and program support that will be added to a previously implemented case whose value was under the congressional notification threshold. The original Foreign Military Sales case, valued at \$19.5 million (\$10.5 million in major defense equipment (MDE)), included sixteen (16) AIM-9X Block II Sidewinder tactical missiles; two (2) AIM-9X Block II tactical guidance units; training; weapon system support; training aids and devices; spare parts; and other related elements of logistics and program support. This notification is for a combined total of the following MDE items: one hundred sixty-eight (168) AIM 9X Block II Sidewinder tactical missiles; ten (10) AIM-9X Block II tactical guidance units; and six (6) AIM-9X Block II captive air training missiles. The following non-MDE items will also be included: training; weapon system support; training aids and devices; spare parts; U.S. Government and contractor engineering, technical, and logistics support services; and other related elements of logistics and program support. The estimated total cost is \$214 million.

This proposed sale will support the foreign policy and national security of the United States by helping to improve the security of a NATO Ally that is an important force for ensuring peace and stability in Europe.

The proposed sale will help improve the security of Lithuania and assist in maintaining political stability, military balance, and economic progress in the region. Lithuania will have no difficulty absorbing these articles and services into its armed forces.

The proposed sale of this equipment and support will not alter the basic military balance in the region.

The principal contractor will be RTX Corporation, located in Arlington, VA. At this time, the U.S. Government is not aware of any offset agreement proposed in connection with this potential sale. Any offset agreement will be defined in negotiations between the purchaser and the contractor.

Implementation of this proposed sale will not require the assignment of any additional U.S. Government or contractor representatives to Lithuania.

There will be no adverse impact on U.S. defense readiness as a result of this proposed sale.

(vii) Sensitivity of Technology:

1. The AIM-9X Block II Sidewinder tactical missile represents a substantial increase in performance over the AIM-9M and replaces the AIM-9X Block I missile configuration. The missile includes a high off-boresight seeker, enhanced countermeasure rejection capability, low drag and high angle of attack airframe, and the ability to integrate the helmet mounted cueing system. The most current AIM-9X Block II operational flight software provides fifth-generation infrared missile capabilities such as lock-on-after-launch, weapons data link, and surface launch.

2. The highest level of classification of defense articles, components, and services included in this potential sale is SECRET.

3. If a technologically advanced adversary were to obtain knowledge of the specific hardware and software elements, the information could be used to develop countermeasures that might reduce system effectiveness or be used in the development of a system with similar or advanced capabilities.

4. A determination has been made that Lithuania can provide substantially the same degree of protection for the sensitive technology being released as the U.S. Government. This proposed sale is necessary in furtherance of the U.S. foreign policy and national security objectives outlined in the Policy Justification.

5. All defense articles and services listed in this transmittal have been

authorized for release and export to the Government of Lithuania.
