**SUMMARY:** In compliance with the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1995 the U.S. Coast Guard is forwarding an Information Collection Request (ICR), abstracted below, to the Office of Management and Budget (OMB), Office of Information and Regulatory Affairs (OIRA), requesting an extension of its approval for the following collection of information: 1625–0129, Intermodal Container Inspection Program; without change. Our ICR describes the information we seek to collect from the public. Review and comments by OIRA ensure we only impose paperwork burdens commensurate with our performance of duties.

**Information Collection Request**

*Title:* Intermodal Container Inspection Program.

*OMB Control Number:* 1625–0129.

*Summary:* The Coast Guard inspects containers and cargo within containers to ensure compliance with domestic and international standards. Coast Guard-issued forms provide stakeholders with the results of container inspections.

*Need:* Under the National Container Inspection Program, Coast Guard personnel inspect intermodal containers and cargo within containers to ensure compliance with applicable regulations and to promote maritime safety, security, and stewardship for U.S. ports and waterways. Specifically, the Coast Guard inspects containers for compliance with the—

- Federal Hazardous Materials Transportation Law,
- International Safe Container Act, and
- International Maritime Dangerous Goods Code.

*Forms:*

- CG–5577, Intermodal Container Inspection Report.
- CG–5577A, Intermodal Container Non-Deficiency Inspection Report.
- CG–5577B, Intermodal Container Targeted Inspection Report.

*Respondents:* Owners of container facilities

*Frequency:* On occasion.

*Hour Burden Estimate:* The estimated burden has increased from 625 hours to 770 hours a year, due to an increase in the estimated annual number of responses.
