General Description of Collection: This information collection involves the submission of various forms by (1) contractors who wish to do business with the FDIC or are currently under contract with the FDIC, (2) those vendors and parties participating in innovation pilot programs and prize competitions with the possibility of being awarded a contract, and (3) government agencies or commercial businesses that provide FDIC with past performance information. The Federal Deposit Insurance Act (the Act) (12 U.S.C. 1819) empowers the FDIC to enter into contracts using private sector contractors to provide goods or services. The Act also provides that the FDIC may promulgate policies and procedures to administer the powers granted to it, including the power to enter into contracts. Pursuant to such policies, the Acquisition and Corporate Services Branch of the FDIC's Division of Administration has developed forms and clauses to facilitate the procurement of goods and services from private sector contractors. The information collected through these forms and clauses falls under the definition of collection of information under the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1995 (PRA). The FDIC is revising Form 7400/04A by removing certain language and

questions in the form to comply with Executive Order 14151. The decreased burden is due to the removal of Questions 3, 4, and 7.

Further, the FDIC is revising its use of these forms to ensure consistency across contracting in the federal government. In alignment with the guidance set forth by the FAR Council, the FDIC will include a new clause to require contractors to report potential discrimination and comply with all applicable nondiscrimination and equal employment opportunity standards as a performance requirement for new contracts. The clause is available at FAR 55.222-90.

Request for Comment

Comments are invited on: (a) whether the collections of information are necessary for the proper performance of the FDIC's functions, including whether the information has practical utility; (b) the accuracy of the estimates of the burden of the information collections, including the validity of the methodology and assumptions used; (c) ways to enhance the quality, utility, and clarity of the information to be collected; and (d) ways to minimize the burden of the collections of information on respondents, including through the use of automated collection techniques

or other forms of information technology. All comments will become a matter of public record.

 This collection comprises the recordkeeping, reporting, and disclosure requirements associated with minimum capital requirements and overall capital adequacy standards for insured state nonmember banks, state savings associations, and certain subsidiaries of those entities. The data is used by the FDIC to evaluate capital before approving various applications by insured depository institutions, to evaluate capital as an essential component in determining safety and soundness, and to determine whether an institution is subject to prompt corrective action provisions.
