I. Introduction

Pursuant to 39 CFR 3041.405, the Commission gives notice that the Postal Service filed request(s) for the Commission to consider matters related to Competitive negotiated service agreement(s). The request(s) may propose the addition of a negotiated service agreement from the Competitive product list or the modification of an existing product currently appearing on the Competitive product list.

The public portions of the Postal Service's request(s) can be accessed via the Commission's website (<http://www.prc.gov>). Non-public portions of the Postal Service's request(s), if any, can be accessed through compliance with the requirements of 39 CFR 3011.301.¹

Comment deadline(s) for each such request, if any, appear in Section II.

Self-Regulatory Organizations; Cboe EDGX Exchange, Inc.; Notice of Filing of Amendment No. 1 and Order Granting Accelerated Approval of a Proposed Rule Change, as Amended by Amendment No. 1, To Extend the Exchange’s Trading Hours to 23 Hours per Day, Five Days per Week

May 29, 2026.

On March 31, 2026, Cboe EDGX Exchange, Inc. (the “Exchange” or “EDGX”) filed with the Securities and Exchange Commission (“Commission”), pursuant to section 19(b)(1) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (the “Act”),¹ and Rule 19b–4 thereunder,² a proposed rule change to permit the Exchange to offer trading for equity securities and exchange traded products 23 hours per day, five days per week.

The proposed rule change was published for comment in the **Federal Register** on April 15, 2026.³ The Commission received comment on the Notice and a response from the Exchange.⁴ On May 26, 2026, the Exchange filed Amendment No. 1 to the proposed rule change, which superseded the original proposed rule change in its entirety (“Amended Proposal”).⁵ The Commission is publishing this notice to solicit comments on Amendment No. 1 from interested persons and is approving the Amended Proposal, on an accelerated basis.

I. Self-Regulatory Organization’s Statement of the Terms of Substance of the Proposed Rule Change

Cboe EDGX Exchange, Inc. (the “Exchange” or “EDGX”) proposes to amend its rules to permit the trading of equity securities and Derivative Securities on the Exchange 23 hours per

day, five days per week. The text of the proposed rule change is in Exhibit 5.

II. Self-Regulatory Organization’s Statement of the Purpose of, and Statutory Basis for, the Proposed Rule Change

In its filing with the Commission, the Exchange included statements concerning the purpose of and basis for the proposed rule change and discussed any comments it received on the proposed rule change. The text of these statements may be examined at the places specified in Item IV below. The Exchange has prepared summaries, set forth in sections A, B, and C below, of the most significant aspects of such statements.

A. Self-Regulatory Organization’s Statement of the Purpose of, and Statutory Basis for, the Proposed Rule Change

Purpose

This Amendment No. 1 to SR–CboeEDGX–2026–019 amends and replaces in its entirety the proposal as originally submitted on April 1, 2026 [sic]. The Exchange submits this Amendment No. 1 in order to clarify
