Abstract: Treasury Decision (TD) 9981 implemented final regulations addressing the prohibition on certain contributions to Type I and Type III supporting organizations, the requirements for qualifying as a Type III supporting organization, and the criteria for qualifying as functionally integrated by supporting a governmental organization. These regulations are necessary to ensure that certain Type III supporting organizations meet the public charity requirements under IRC section 509(a)(3). Type III supporting organizations, which are the respondents, are responsible for collecting the necessary information from their supported organizations and providing it to the Internal Revenue Service upon request.

Current Actions: There is no change to the previously approved information collection.

benefits cannot be made. It would affect eligible transitioning Service members, Veterans, and dependents in obtaining educational and vocational counseling. Collection of the information is the only way for VA to determine eligibility for Chapter 36 benefits. Without this information, determination of entitlement would not be possible.

The **Federal Register** Notice with a 60-day comment period soliciting comments on this collection of information was published at 91 FR 14634, March 25, 2026.
