This constitutes notice, in accordance with 18 CFR 385.2201(b), of the receipt of prohibited and exempt off-the-record communications.

Order No. 607 (64 FR 51222, September 22, 1999) requires Commission decisional employees, who make or receive a prohibited or exempt off-the-record communication relevant to the merits of a contested proceeding, to deliver to the Secretary of the Commission, a copy of the communication, if written, or a summary of the substance of any oral communication.

Prohibited communications are included in a public, non-decisional file associated with, but not a part of, the decisional record of the proceeding. Parties to a proceeding may seek the opportunity to respond to any facts or contentions made in a prohibited off-the-record communication and may request that the Commission place the prohibited communication and responses thereto in the decisional record. The Commission will grant such a request only when it determines that fairness so requires. Any person identified below as having made a prohibited off-the-record communication shall serve the document on all parties listed on the official service list for the applicable proceeding in accordance with Rule 2010, 18 CFR 385.2010.

Exempt off-the-record communications are included in the decisional record of the proceeding, unless the communication was with a cooperating agency as described by 40 CFR 1501.6, made under 18 CFR 385.2201(e)(1)(v).

Clean Air Act Operating Permit Program; Petition for Objection to State Operating Permit for Lubrizol Corporation, Harris County, Texas

AGENCY: Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).

ACTION: Notice of final order on petition.

SUMMARY: The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Administrator signed an Order dated May 11, 2026, denying petitions dated March 10, 2025, and September 10, 2025, from Harris County Attorney's Office (the Petitioner). The petitions requested that the EPA object to Clean Air Act (CAA) title V operating permits issued by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) to the Lubrizol Corporation, for its Deer Park Plant located in Harris County, Texas.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The EPA received petitions from Harris County Attorney's Office dated March 10, 2025, and September 10, 2025, requesting that the EPA object to the issuance of operating permit No. O1931 and O1932, issued by TCEQ to Lubrizol Corporation, for its Deer Park Plant located in Harris County, Texas. On May 11, 2026, the EPA Administrator issued an Order denying the petitions. The order itself explains the basis for the EPA's decision.
