Needs and Uses: The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) collects property and ownership information from residential property owners to implement its Nonstructural Flood Risk Management Program. This collection is authorized under Section 73 of the Water Resources Development Act of 1974 (33 U.S.C. 701b-11), Executive Order 11988 (Floodplain Management), and Engineer Regulation 1165-2-26, which mandate the evaluation and implementation of nonstructural measures—such as home elevations and floodproofing—to reduce flood damages. Under authorized and funded projects, USACE collaborates with Non-Federal Sponsors to execute these cost-shared flood risk reduction measures.

Information is collected through a phased approach using four instruments (Interest Form, Application Form—Part I, Application Form—Part II, and a Right of Entry Form) administered via a secure online portal (ArcGIS Survey123) or in paper/PDF format. This site-specific data is required to validate property eligibility, assess structural suitability, identify potential property hazards or legal encumbrances, and develop construction cost estimates. Ultimately, the collection enables USACE to verify property characteristics through on-site visual inspections and execute formal participant agreements with eligible property owners. Without this information, USACE cannot fulfill its statutory mission to execute Congressionally-authorized flood risk reduction projects.
