Town of Dover-Foxcroft; Notice of Intent To Prepare an Environmental Assessment

On May 1, 2026, the Town of Dover-Foxcroft (exemptee) filed an application for surrender of exemption from licensing for the Moosehead Hydroelectric Project No. 5912. The project is located on the Piscataquis River in the Town of Dover-Foxcroft in

Piscataquis County, Maine and does not occupy federal lands.

The exemptee proposes to surrender its exemption from licensing. The project has been inoperable since 2007. The Town determined that repair and redevelopment of the hydroelectric project would be cost prohibitive and uneconomical. The Town proposes to decommission the project by entirely removing the dam and powerhouse and restoring the riverbed.

A Notice of Application for Surrender of Exemption Accepted for Filing and Soliciting Comments, Motions to Intervene, and Protests was issued on June 5, 2026. The National Marine
