

SUMMARY: The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), as part of its continuing effort to reduce paperwork and respondent burden, invites the general public to take this opportunity to comment on an extension, with change, of a currently approved information collection. In accordance with the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1995, this notice seeks comments concerning the Community Disaster Loan (CDL) Program. This collection allows the Federal Government to make loans to local governments that have suffered economic problems due to disasters.

DATES: Comments must be submitted on or before October 5, 2026.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The information collection is required for Community Disaster Loan (CDL) Program eligibility determinations, CDL management, and compliance with other Federal laws and regulations. The CDL Program is authorized by Section 417 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (Pub. L. 93-288, as amended, 88 Stat. 143 (42 U.S.C. 5184) and implementing regulations at 44 CFR part 206, subpart K. FEMA may make a CDL to any local government which has suffered a substantial loss of tax or other revenues as a result of a major disaster or emergency and which demonstrates a need for Federal financial assistance to perform its governmental functions.

The CDL must be justified on the basis of need and be based on the actual and projected expenses, as a result of the disaster, for the fiscal year in which the disaster occurred and the three succeeding fiscal years. FEMA has the authority to cancel repayment of all or part of these CDLs to the extent that a determination is made that revenues of the local government during the three fiscal years following the disaster are insufficient to meet the operating budget of that local government because of disaster related revenue losses and additional unreimbursed disaster-related municipal operating expenses.

The proposed information collection would revise FEMA Form-104-FY-22-224, Promissory Note to remove Part III—Schedule of Loan Increments to Be Disbursed to Borrower. FEMA has determined that the information was not sufficiently useful to reviewing the application and opted to eliminate the entire table titled “Part III—Schedule of Loan Increments to Be Disbursed to Borrower” from the form.

Description of the need for the information and proposed use: HUD’s Office of Native American Programs (ONAP) will use the pre-award and post-award information collected to assess program feasibility and compliance, monitor program performance throughout the grant term, and to report annually to Congress. ONAP is responsible for managing the IHBG Formula and IHBG Competitive programs, as described below.

IHBG Formula Program: The Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Reauthorization Act of 1996 (25 U.S.C. 4101 *et seq.*) (NAHASDA) authorizes the IHBG

Formula program which supports the development, management, and operation of affordable homeownership and rental housing; infrastructure development; and other forms of housing assistance intended for low-income persons. Federally recognized Native American Tribes, Alaska Native Villages, tribally designated housing entities, and a limited number of State-recognized Tribes that were funded under the Indian Housing Program authorized by the U.S. Housing Act of 1937 are eligible to receive IHBG funds. Under the IHBG Formula Program, eligible recipients receive an equitable share of funds as appropriated by Congress based on housing stock and housing needs, and other funding criteria.

IHBG Competitive Program: Since 2018, Congress has appropriated additional funding under the IHBG Formula program for the IHBG Competitive Grant (IHBG-COMP). IHBG-COMP prioritizes projects that increase the availability of affordable housing in Tribal communities with consideration to the extent of need and administrative capacity. The regulations and requirements governing the IHBG Formula Program apply to the IHBG Competitive Program. The IHBG-COMP Notices of Funding Opportunities are published on Grants.gov, where applicants submit applications.

AGENCY: Office of Policy Development and Research, Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

ACTION: Notice of a Re-established Matching Program.

SUMMARY: Pursuant to the Privacy Act of 1974, as amended, HUD is providing

notice of its intent to re-establish a matching program with Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) for a recurring matching program with HUD's Office of Public and Indian Housing (PIH) and Multifamily Housing (MFH), involving comparisons of information pertaining to participants in authorized HUD rental housing assistance program with the independent sources of income information available through the National Directory of New Hires (NDNH) maintained by HHS. After verifying the comparison outcomes, HUD will upload the information into the Enterprise Income Verification (EIV) system of records, maintained by HUD, and make it available to: (1) Program administrators such as public housing agencies (PHAs) and private owners and management agents (O/As) (collectively referred to as POAs) to enable them to verify the accuracy of income reported by the tenants (participants) of HUD rental assistance programs and (2) contract administrators (CAs) overseeing and monitoring O/A operations as well as independent public auditors (IPAs) that audit both PHAs and O/As. The most recent renewal of the current matching agreement expires on September 8, 2026.

DATES: *Comment Due Date:* September 3, 2026. The period of this matching program is estimated to cover the 18-month period from September 9, 2026 through March 8, 2028. However, the computer matching agreement (CMA) will become applicable on the latter of the following two dates: September 9, 2026 or 30 days after publication of this notice in the **Federal Register**, provided no public comments are received that require modification to the notice and republication for an additional 30-day comment period. The matching program will continue for 18 months after the applicable date and may be extended for an additional 12 months if the respective agency Data Integrity Boards (DIBs) determine that the conditions

specified in 5 U.S.C. 552a(o)(2)(D) have been met.
