The complex would consist of a non-power, open-pool reactor facility, a separation processing hot cell facility, a target fabrication facility, and a waste packaging, handling, and storage facility. In response to a notice published in the **Federal Register** on July 16, 2026 (91 FR 43673), Nicolas R. Maxwell filed a hearing request on September 14, 2026.
