Agreements With Cyprus, Guatemala,  
and Peru Action: Notice**

**SUMMARY:** The Assistant Secretary of State for Educational and Cultural Affairs calls a meeting of the Cultural Property Advisory Committee in accordance with the Convention on Cultural Property Implementation Act (“the Act”). The Committee will review proposed extensions of bilateral cultural property agreements with Cyprus, Guatemala, and Peru. A portion of this meeting will be closed to the public.

**DATES:** The Committee will meet from October 27–29, 2026, from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (EDT).

**ADDRESSES:** The Committee will meet virtually. The public will participate via videoconference.

**Proposed Agreement Extensions:** Pursuant to the authority vested in the Assistant Secretary of State for Educational and Cultural Affairs, and pursuant to 19 U.S.C. 2602(f)(1), an extension of the following three bilateral

cultural property agreements is hereby proposed:

- *the Agreement Between the Government of the United States of America and the Government of the Republic of Cyprus Concerning the Imposition of Import Restrictions on Categories of Archaeological and Ethnological Material of the Republic of Cyprus.*

- *the Memorandum of Understanding between the Government of the United States of America and the Government of the Republic of Guatemala Concerning the Imposition of Import Restrictions on Categories of Archaeological and Ethnological Material of Guatemala.*

- *the Agreement Between the Government of The United States of America and the Government of The Republic of Peru Concerning the Imposition of Import Restrictions on Categories of Archaeological and Ethnological Material of Peru.*
