

Agencies, etc. Business respondents include not-for-profit local WIC Sites, not-for-profit SFSP Sponsors and Sites, not-for-profit CACFP Sponsors and Providers, not-for-profit TEFAP ERAs and EFOs, not-for-profit CSFP Local Agencies, etc.

Estimated Number of Respondents: The estimated number of annual respondents is 19,626, which includes State Program Directors (326 total) and local-level program administrators from local government agencies (9,500 total) and businesses (9,800 total). The total number of respondents includes an estimated 15,766 total responsive entities as well as 3,860 local program administrators from both local agencies (1,900 total) and businesses (1,960 total) whom FNA expects will not respond to the information collection request.

Estimated Number of Responses per Respondent: Approximately once each year, State agencies responsible for a program will be asked to update contact information for their respective local agencies as part of the sample frame data collection. Any single individual respondent, State agency or local program operator, will receive no more than three surveys about the same FNA program in a given year, with each expected to receive a single survey in a given year. Including recruitment requests for the surveys, FNA estimates that respondents will average 2 responses per year.

Estimated Total Annual Responses: There will be an estimated 39,252 annual responses, or 117,756 responses over the three-year clearance period.

Estimated Time per Response: The estimated time per response ranges from 3 minutes (0.05 hours) to 1 hour for respondents and 1 minute (0.02 hours) for non-respondents, depending on the data collection activity, as shown in the table below. The average estimated time across all responses is approximately 14 minutes (0.24 hours).

Estimated Total Annual Burden on Respondents: The estimated total annual burden is 9,135.40 hours, for a total of 27,406.20 over the three-year clearance period. See the table below for estimated total annual burden for each type of collection and respondent.

Notice of Formal Determination on Records Release

AGENCY: Civil Rights Cold Case Records Review Board.

ACTION: Notice.

SUMMARY: The Civil Rights Cold Case Records Review Board received 3,362

pages of records from the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA) related to three civil rights cold case incidents to which the Review Board assigned the unique identifiers 2023-001-007, 2023-001-008, and 2023-002-0003. NARA proposed 450 postponements including postponements of sealed federal grand jury information in the records. After consultation with the Review Board, NARA withdrew 25 postponements. On September 18, 2026, the Review Board met and approved 424 postponements and determined that 2,987 pages in full and 63 pages in part should be publicly disclosed in the Civil Rights Cold Case Records Collection. The Review Board

will request that the Attorney General petition the relevant court to unseal federal grand jury information in the records for incident 2023-001-007. By issuing this notice, the Review Board complies with the Civil Rights Cold Case Records Collection Act of 2018 that requires the Review Board to publish in the **Federal Register** its determinations on the disclosure or postponement of records in the Collection no more than 14 days after the date of its decision.

Foreign-Trade Zone 38; Application for Subzone; JAS Forwarding (USA), Inc.; Greer, South Carolina

An application has been submitted to the Foreign-Trade Zones Board by the South Carolina State Ports Authority, grantee of FTZ 38, requesting subzone status for the facility of JAS Forwarding (USA), Inc., located in Greer, South Carolina. The application was submitted pursuant to the provisions of the Foreign-Trade Zones Act, as amended (19 U.S.C. 81a-81u), and the regulations of the FTZ Board (15 CFR part 400). It was formally docketed on September 11, 2026.

Foreign-Trade Zone (FTZ) 272, Notification of Proposed Production Activity; Piramal Critical Care, Inc.; (Pharmaceutical Anesthetics); Bethlehem, Pennsylvania

Piramal Critical Care, Inc. submitted a notification of proposed production activity to the FTZ Board (the Board) for its facility in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, within Subzone 272B. The notification conforming to the requirements of the Board's regulations (15 CFR 400.22) was received on August 31, 2026.

Pursuant to 15 CFR 400.14(b), FTZ production activity would be limited to the specific foreign-status material(s)/ component(s) described in the submitted notification (summarized below) and subsequently authorized by the Board. The benefits that may stem from conducting production activity under FTZ procedures are explained in the background section of the Board's website—accessible via www.trade.gov/ftz. The proposed material(s)/ component(s) would be added to the production authority that the Board previously approved for the operation, as reflected on the Board's website.

The proposed foreign-status materials/components include 2-(Chloromethoxy)-1,1,1,3,3,3-hexafluoropropane (HFCMOP),

pharmaceutical grade glass bottles, and plastic integrated closures with duty rate ranges from duty-free to 5.3%.

The request indicates that certain materials/components are subject to duties section 301 of the Trade Act of 1974, depending on the country of origin. The applicable section 301 decision requires certain subject merchandise to be admitted to FTZs in privileged foreign status as described in 19 CFR 146.41.
