Fisheries of the Exclusive Economic Zone Off Alaska; Atka Mackerel in the Bering Sea Subarea and Eastern Aleutian District of the Bering Sea and Aleutian Islands Management Area

AGENCY: National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS), National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), Commerce.

ACTION: Temporary rule; closure.

SUMMARY: NMFS is prohibiting directed fishing for Atka mackerel in the Bering Sea subarea and Eastern Aleutian District (BS/EAI) of the Bering Sea and Aleutian Islands management area (BSAI) by vessels participating in the BSAI trawl limited access sector fishery. This action is necessary to prevent exceeding the 2025 total allowable catch (TAC) of Atka mackerel in the BS/EAI allocated to vessels participating in the BSAI trawl limited access sector fishery.

DATES: Effective 1200 hours, Alaska local time (A.l.t.), October 9, 2025,

through 2400 hours, A.l.t., December 31, 2025.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: NMFS manages the groundfish fishery in the BSAI exclusive economic zone according to the Fishery Management Plan for Groundfish of the Bering Sea and Aleutian Islands Management Area (FMP) prepared and recommended by the North Pacific Fishery Management Council under authority of the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act (Magnuson-Stevens Act). Regulations governing fishing by U.S. vessels in accordance with the FMP appear at subpart H of 50 CFR part 600 and 50 CFR part 679.

The 2025 TAC of Atka mackerel, in the BS/EAI, allocated to vessels participating in the BSAI trawl limited access sector fishery was established as a directed fishing allowance of 3,386 metric tons by the final 2025 and 2026 harvest specifications for groundfish in the BSAI (90 FR 12640, March 18, 2025).

In accordance with § 679.20(d)(1)(iii), the Regional Administrator has determined that the 2025 Atka mackerel TAC allocated to vessels in the BSAI trawl limited access sector in the BS/EAI will be or has been reached. Consequently, NMFS is prohibiting directed fishing for Atka mackerel by vessels participating in the BSAI trawl limited access sector fishery in the BS/EAI to prevent exceeding this sector's allocation of Atka mackerel TAC.

While this closure is effective, the maximum retainable amounts at § 679.20(e) and (f) apply at any time during a trip.

Classification

NMFS issues this action pursuant to section 305(d) of the Magnuson-Stevens Act. This action is required by 50 CFR part 679, which was issued pursuant to section 304(b) of the Magnuson-Stevens Act, and is exempt from review under Executive Order 12866.

Pursuant to 5 U.S.C. 553(b)(B), there is good cause to waive prior notice and an opportunity for public comment on this action, as notice and comment would be impracticable and contrary to the public interest, as it would prevent NMFS from responding to the most recent fisheries data on Atka mackerel catch in a timely fashion and would delay the directed fishing closure of Atka mackerel by vessels participating in the BSAI trawl limited access sector fishery in the BS/EAI. NMFS was unable to publish a notice providing time for public comment because the most recent, relevant data on Atka mackerel catch in the BS/EAI by vessels participating in the BSAI trawl limited access sector fishery only became available as of October 6, 2025.

There is good cause under 5 U.S.C. 553(d)(3) to waive the 30-day delay in the effective date of this action. This finding is based upon the reasons provided above for waiver of prior notice and opportunity for public comment.

SUMMARY: PHMSA is publishing this notice to solicit public comments on a request for three special permit segment extensions submitted by Natural Gas Pipeline Company of America (NGPL), a subsidiary of Kinder Morgan, Inc. NGPL is seeking relief from compliance with certain requirements in the Federal pipeline safety regulations. At the conclusion of the 30-day comment period, PHMSA will review the comments received from this notice as part of its evaluation to grant or deny the special permit request.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: PHMSA received a special permit request from Natural Gas Pipeline Company of America (NGPL), a subsidiary of Kinder Morgan, Inc., on August 20, 2025, seeking three special permit segment extensions to be incorporated into special permit PHMSA–2025–0011. The extensions request is a part of the active permit’s special permit inspection area. Special permit PHMSA–2025–0011 allows NGPL to deviate from the Federal pipeline safety regulations in 49 CFR 192.611(a), (d), and 192.619(a), where Louisiana Line #2 gas transmission pipeline segments have undergone a change from a Class 1 to a Class 3 location.

Special permit PHMSA–2025–0011 is active and was granted on July 28, 2025, and is effective until July 28, 2035 for 16 special permit segments, which include 54,744 feet (approximately 10.37 miles) of the NGPL natural gas transmission pipeline system located in the State of Texas. The special permit segment extensions are requested for 1,333 feet (approximately 0.25 miles). If granted, the special permit segments would total 56,077 feet (approximately 10.62 miles).

The active special permit segments and requested special permit segment extensions are detailed in updated Attachment A—NGPL Segment Integrity Information, published on <https://www.regulations.gov> with this notice. Maps of the Louisiana Line #2 pipeline are available on the National Pipeline Mapping System (NPMS) at www.npms.phmsa.dot.gov. To search for maps of Louisiana Line #2 select Use Public Map Viewer tool, search by State and county, and use the Query Tool to search by Operator ID to find NGPL pipelines operated in each county. The latitude and longitude global positioning system coordinates in Attachment A may be entered into the NPMS Public Map Viewer search box. Upon receipt of this request, PHMSA reviewed the Final Environmental Assessment (FEA) and finds that the expansion of the proposed special permit would not result in significant impacts to the human environment. Furthermore, the existing FEA and Finding of No Significant Impact remain adequate, pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, as amended (42 U.S.C. 4321 *et seq.*). No further environmental assessment is required for this proposal.

NGPL's special permit segment extensions request, active special permit

with conditions, and FEA are available for review and public comment in Docket No. PHMSA-2025-0011. PHMSA invites interested persons to review and submit comments in the docket on the special permit segment extensions request. Please submit comments on any potential safety, environmental, and other relevant considerations implicated by the special permit request. Comments may include relevant data.

Before issuing a decision on the special permit request, PHMSA will evaluate all comments received on or

before the comment closing date. PHMSA will consider each relevant comment it receives in making its decision to grant or deny this special permit request.

Leif Erikson Day, 2025

By the President of the United States of America**A Proclamation**

More than a millennium ago, legendary Norse Viking Leif Erikson forever changed the course of history when he fearlessly embarked on a daring expedition into the unknown, becoming the first European to ever set foot in the New World. This Leif Erikson Day, we summon his courage, we honor his enduring legacy of adventure and exploration, and we renew our resolve to advance the limits of human achievement.

According to tradition, Leif Erikson's zeal for adventure began as a young man in Greenland, where he heard stories of distant lands across the sea. Determined to chart those waters himself, and guided by his deep Christian faith, he assembled a brave crew and set sail, voyaging more than 1,800 miles across the Atlantic Ocean through brutal winds and storms. With courage in his veins and faith in his God, Erikson realized his purpose when he reached the shores of a land he called "Vinland," known today as L'Anse aux Meadows at the northern tip of Newfoundland, Canada.

With this incredible discovery, Leif Erikson became the first European to land in North America and cemented his place as one of the great explorers in world history. He returned home a hero, bringing with him the exciting news of uncivilized lands. His achievement inspired countless explorers to venture into North America, and ultimately paved the way for the first American settlement in Jamestown, Virginia, more than 600 years later.

Together, with our allies in Norway, Sweden, Denmark, Iceland, and Finland, we are advancing fair trade and promoting peace through strength—ensuring a safer and more prosperous future for America and the North Atlantic.



Proclamation 10980 of October 9, 2025

Columbus Day, 2025

By the President of the United States of America

A Proclamation

Today our Nation honors the legendary Christopher Columbus—the original American hero, a giant of Western civilization, and one of the most gallant and visionary men to ever walk the face of the earth. This Columbus Day, we honor his life with reverence and gratitude, and we pledge to reclaim his extraordinary legacy of faith, courage, perseverance, and virtue from the left-wing arsonists who have sought to destroy his name and dishonor his memory.

Born in Genoa, Italy in 1451, Columbus quickly emerged as a titan of the Age of Exploration. On August 3, 1492, following years of intense study, preparation, and petitioning, Christopher Columbus secured funding from the Spanish Crown to set out on a daring expedition that most believed to be impossible. Commissioned by Ferdinand and Isabella of Spain, Columbus and his crew boarded three small ships—the Niña, Pinta, and Santa Maria—to set sail on a perilous voyage across the Atlantic. 
This Columbus Day, more than 500 years since Columbus arrived in the New World, we follow his example, we echo his resolve, and we offer
